SENATOR HILGERT: Thank you, Mr. President, members. I rise in support of the motion to return to Select File. But I do want to use this opportunity, and I assume Senator Chambers does as well, to discuss the bill. There are some things, I think, we need to get into the record and talk about. And I would draw the bodies attention, and Senator Chambers specifically, because I will ask him some questions about his...what intends that this should mean. On page 2, line 16, and then going into 17, there's a phrase there that says, "from jurisdictions outside the jurisdiction where the death occurred". For example, if the jurisdiction of the State Highway Patrol is the state of Nebraska, according to this phrase in your amendment would the State Highway Patrol have to have the team come from outside the jurisdiction, would be outside the state of Nebraska? And would you like to clarify that, Senator Chambers, if you would.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Mr. President, members of the Legislature. What I would like to clarify is the meaning of the language rather the question posed. And maybe I'll answer the question at the same time.
