in the killing. So, in this instance the term "jurisdiction" would apply to the State Patrol as the entity which employed the officer. That would mean that nobody who worked for the State Patrol could be a part of this investigative team that is selected or put together by the special prosecutor. But it would not prohibit the State Patrol being on the scene where this occurred, preserving the evidence, protecting the scene and those other specifics laid out in the amendment. So now, to give another example, Senator Hilgert mentioned the State Patrol. As I said earlier, if an Omaha Police Officer had been involved in the killing, no member of the Omaha Police Division could be on the three-person team that the special prosecutor would designate. But there could be at least one person from a law enforcement agency within that county. So the term "jurisdiction" is not to embrace the entire county in which the entity exists who hires the officer. And, Senator Hilgert, the term "jurisdiction" was accepted, because the officers and representatives of law enforcement kept mentioning a multijurisdictional force. So rather than indicate to them that something different is being put into the law than what was discussed, that term "jurisdiction" was used, and I had said I would clarify what it means on the floor of the Legislature. So, if there is still a question in your mind, or anybody else's as to what it means, put them to me and I'll be as clear and direct as I can.

SENATOR HILGERT: Thank you, Senator Chambers. And thank you for clearing that up. I do think that we needed to get that real clear on the floor regarding the meaning of the word "jurisdiction" in line 16 in your amendment. Furthermore, I would like to add that I received a communication, and I believe the body did as well, from David Friend, President of the Omaha Police Union, in support of LB 73. The Omaha Police Officers do state unequivocally that, although they were initially opposed to LB 73, which is the amendment 852,...

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: One minute.

SENATOR HILGERT: ...that they are in fact comfortable with the bill as amended, and feel that the amended version addresses the concerns that they had in fact raised during the committee hearing. And the Omaha Police Union does urge that the Nebraska
