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County Sheriff's have jurisdiction in all of Douglas County, they still can participate in this team, then in my way of thinking the definition, as it applies to this bill, should be clarified. And I know you've given statement of intent on the floor. But I think the better approach, when we're dealing with something this important, would be to put that definition into the bill. Another question I would have for you is on page 2, line 7, where it says, and this is after the death occurs and before you have the special prosecutor or team involved the case shall be treated as an open...

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: One minute.

SENATOR BROMM: ...as an open, ongoing matter, until all evidence, reports and other relevant material has been assembled. Now, what does "open" mean?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: It means that this preliminary work done by the jurisdiction or the agency involved in the shooting is not going to be the totality of the investigation, that their preserving of the scene and the evidence does not constitute the entire investigation. At a subsequent time, this team is going to come into place and they will continue, and they will start by reviewing the material presented to them as the language of the bill says.

SENATOR BROMM: But it says it's open until the material has been transferred to the special prosecutor.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes.

SENATOR BROMM: Does that infer then that then it becomes concluded?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: No, the part that the local...

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Time.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...jurisdiction is going to...
