out bills that those county attorneys want. This has set a new tone, as far as I'm concerned. And now I want to make something crystal clear, as I tried to do before. I'm not talking about the questions raised by Senator Bromm or the observations he made. Anytime you have a change in the law, people are entitled to raise any question they choose. And I've made myself available, but I'm aware of some people outside this Chamber who are working against this bill, and they're trying to do it under the guise of something else and hoping that they can get it done a different way. So I'm distinguishing between the issues that were raised by Senator Bromm. And when a bill is returned, if the amendment is adopted and the bill is readvanced, it's not going to be voted on. So in the same way that Senator Bromm has granted concessions to me, this is what I will say, and not just for Senator Bromm, but anybody, in order that these county attorneys, and by the way I'm going to tell, I've talked to the President of the County Attorneys Association. I talked to Trent Nowka, who represents them, and Bruce Cutshall was there, too, so I'm letting you all know that I've talked to people with those associations. You saw the letters from the Omaha Police Union, and that police umbrella organization. I'm not blowing smoke, but I made a mistake trying to work with them, 'cause I can get my way a different way. But it's far bloodier, it's far more painful, but I get what I want, or nobody gets anything.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: But I'm trying to do something different. So I'm going to ask that we return this bill, that enough of you will vote to adopt the amendment, we readvance it, then all these county attorneys, because the police are sticking by what they said, these county attorneys will know the form of the bill. They won't have to say, well there's an amendment here, there's an amendment there and so forth. They will know what we're dealing with, we will all know. And then when they start coming in with this stuff again, then you'll see what it is I'm talking about. So I'm going to ask that this vote to return the bill be successful. And, Mr. President, I will ask for a call of the house, but I'll take a machine vote.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: If senators would check in, we are on Final Reading. Members, we are on Final Reading. If you would please
