What I would suggest, and this would be in line with how we've handled these matters previously, is that this expense be borne by the state, and that the...and that Senator Chambers give us just a little time to put such an amendment on, if you agree that this is the kind of unusual and once in a while expense that we generally try to alleviate...try to alleviate for counties, just as we did by...when we formed the...you may remember the Public Defender Act, they gave assistance to, that now gives assistance to counties that have extraordinary expenses related to public defense. So, it's twelve o'clock. I don't know how Senator Chambers feels, but I would ask you, Senator Chambers, if it does not make some sense that possibly there was a misunderstanding with...insofar as Lancaster County itself is involved, as opposed to their county attorney, and that if the weekend could be had to look at this matter, and if Senator Bromm or one or two others have a couple of additional matters on the details, it seems to me that this is a matter that ought to be able to be worked out in short order. And it seems to me not unreasonable to request to do so, because this is Final Reading, there should be a little opportunity for an interplay of ideas. And in one sense, Senator Chambers,...

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: One minute.

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...you should give to others what we all agree is a great benefit you do to this Legislature, in the sense that you exercise your independent judgment and have your own ideas, personally you, about how things should be done with your legislation and with everybody else's. And I'd be the first to say I'm glad that's true. But, Senator Bromm, Senator Wickersham, others who weren't involved in the negotiations, their lawyers, their independent people, they have opinions, and they ought to have an opportunity to have at least one session to sit down and talk about how there might be further adjustments to this without being in the position of trying to tear it down, because nobody is trying to tear it down. I think everybody has a positive attitude towards it. I think all we need is a little more time. Thank you.
