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so, yes, with that, I am going to support it. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Schmitt. Senator Landis.

SENATOR LANDIS: Mr. Speaker, members of the Legislature, I intend to vote to adopt the amendment. I intend to vote to advance the bill putting it on Final Reading, which is where Senator Chambers wants it. I intend to turn around to the people of Lincoln or Lancaster County, who have expressed interest here, and ask them what it is that they're...that the problem is, and to put it in the form of an amendment to take it to Senator Chambers and let him examine it, and if not, take it as an amendment on Final Reading, just like Senator Chambers is today, another day, not today, another day. I intend to adopt...vote for the Select File amendment. I intend to vote for advance, and then I think it is up to the critics of the bill to find a later day an amendment to offer to the body and Senator Chambers for his consideration, rather than to interfere with this process at this moment. We have another round on this thing because this will be back on Final Reading and available for an amendment, to the city of Lincoln or Lancaster County, if they want to exercise that in the future, and they can use that. Right now, they haven't put, I think, their claims in the form of a usable piece of information that Senator Chambers could deal nor could the body. I'd suggest we advance the amendment, put the bill back on Final Reading, and make the gainsayers come up with their, you know, with an appropriate bill of particulars, submit it to the introducer, and submit it to the body directly.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Landis, Seeing no further lights, Senator Chambers, you're recognized to close on AMO852 to LB 72.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, one thing I have to make clear. It was called to my attention. I had blamed this on the county attorneys, what's that...it was not the county attorneys. It was not Trent Nowka. It was the lobbyist for the city of Lincoln, and I want her to know this. She was about to get her rear end caught in a wringer on a bill from Lincoln and came to me for help, and I spent time with her.
