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SENATOR WICKERSHAM: The counties...

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Wickersham.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Okay. The counties, I don't know of any mechanisms for the counties directly to share revenues with the SIDs. They might be able to develop those through interlocal agreements and, well, for the provisions of LB 87. But there aren't any provisions that I'm aware of for them to do that now. What I suggested, Senator Wehrbein, was that the counties might be able to deliver services to the SIDs. SIDs go out and build roads and then, and under the current structure, it's my understanding SIDs have to contract...

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: One minute.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: ...with the counties for maintenance of those roads, snow clearing, et cetera. If the SIDs didn't have to contract for that they would have a service delivered and wouldn't have that additional expense at the local level. If this allows the counties to be able to extend that service, then I think that would be appropriate, but there isn't any way for the county to just, that I'm aware of, to give an SID money.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Okay. But even if they gave them services, I know I'm (inaudible) up a close, but just to throw out the issue. I would think if counties are up against a levy limit they're not about to even help someone else if they don't have to. I assume we're in that position in some counties. Thanks.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator. Further discussion, Senator Hartnett.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Lieutenant Governor, members of the body, Senator Wehrbein brought up about SIDs and I think SIDs were on against 413 and they got themselves be...they didn't realize what was happening (laugh) with this constitutional amendment. They were concerned about another constitutional amendment. And the counties do, I think as Senator Wickersham says, do some services for SIDs and there is no mechanism in this for them to do that unless they want to do that. But most of the SIDs are
