located, I think, from our...we've had SID legislation in the committee that I chair for years (laugh), looking at Senator Schimek's face. But it's basically located in two...basically in two counties, that's Sarpy and Douglas County, and I don't know how anxious they are to do things but I think one thing I'm looking at is road miles. Because a lot of the road miles that goes into Sarpy and Douglas County are made up of SIDs, which they get money that way. So I may be bringing an amendment so that maybe SIDs can tap into some of the funds that they get from the state through road miles, so I'm working on that...that issues. But I think SIDs do contribute something to the growth. It's a mechanism that the state has set up and the road miles are counted as part of the county roads in both...both...I think in major that..in the two counties, so.... But I do rise to support the committee amendments of the...as brought forward by the Revenue Committee.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Wickersham (sic). Further discussion on the committee amendments? Speaker Kristensen.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Thank you, Mr. President, members of the Legislature. Senator Wickersham, what I think I'm going to do so we can move off the committee amendments, as I know there's other discussions this morning, the body needs to understand that there is a huge problem that's going to occur here with community colleges at some point in time. There are other ways to address it. The issue is it needs to be addressed. The constitutional change is one that this body did support. We understand that. It's also one that we've got some commitment that's got to come back to those community colleges. Through the loss, and I want to really emphasize this, is that they're going to lose 3...\$650,000 each year by...by this formula. Now this is one that they're willing to basically give up, but what they can't give up is the \$4.2 million of operating. And so on Select File, I'm going to withdraw my amendment that I have to the A bill that accompanies this on General File with the understanding that the Appropriations Committee is going to look at this issue and by the time this bill comes back up on Select File we'll have some indication. If it doesn't look like there is some way to take that and reallocate some of the other monies on some of the other formulas and flow it to the community
