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through those. If you wish to speak to the underlying amendment I'll leave your light on. If not, just waive off. If you want to speak on the overruling the Chair, I'll recognize you. Senator Tyson.

SENATOR TYSON: Thank you, Mr. Speaker, members of the body. I can certainly sympathize with the plight of the natural resource districts, but I don't know whether...what the impact is on the natural resource district that I represent or that portion of the district that I represent, which is the Lower Elkhorn. I don't know the impact. I don't know if they have additional revenue sources, additional levying capacity. I simply don't know. Now Senator Beutler is attempting to correct a situation that was brought upon by the passage of an amendment and that amendment was passed by the voters and I can't tell you now if they voted in full knowledge of the impact of that amendment or if they voted in ignorance of the impact of that amendment. I didn't know it when I voted for the amendment in the polling booth. But I think that the correction for this problem has to go through the same venue as the cause of this problem. We have to make the assumption that the voters knew what they were doing and if this amendment has to be corrected, it should be corrected the same way that it was brought into being, which was by a vote of the people. In essence, I guess I'm saying that, while I can certainly sympathize with what Senator Beutler is trying to do, if in fact it is needed, and I don't know that it is, two wrongs don't make a right. Fifty wrongs don't make a right. I think we have to look at our responsibility in reacting to the wishes of the voters, which was clearly expressed when that amendment was passed and, on that basis, I am going to support the Chair. Thank you.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Matzke, do you wish to speak to the motion to overrule, or to the underlying amendment?

SENATOR MATZKE: Mr. Speaker and members of the Legislature, I wish to address the issue of germaneness. I support the motion to overrule the Chair because I believe that Senator Beutler's amendment is germane to this bill. If you read the bill the language is clear, and I quote, says, shall be...a certain percentage of the revenue shall be allocated to the county; another provision, shall be allocated to the city or village,
