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colleges. I'm concerned about the ESUs and I'm concerned about the other two as well. But that concern doesn't translate into what is perhaps not our best considered actions on General File. And again, if you want to...

**SPEAKER KRISTENSEN:** One minute.

**SENATOR WICKERSHAM:** ...blame the Revenue Committee for not bringing those kind of complex proposals to you in the context of this bill, I will accept blame on the part of the committee. But we thought we had time to do that. It's my belief that we have time to do that in a more considered way and we will bring that to you next year.

**PRESIDENT MAURSTAD:** Senator Chambers.

**SENATOR CHAMBERS:** Mr. President, members of the Legislature, what we've done, from time to time, is address comments to the new senators so we can kind of acclimate them to how things go and how we do. I always have been for an expansive or liberal interpretation of the germaneness rule. It is one of those rules which is either like a chameleon or like a rubber band, it stretches to accommodate the circumstances; it changes in meaning, texture and coloration, depending on where we are in the session and how important people feel it is to get a particular measure before us. So, I am in favor of a rule which allows us to conduct the business that needs to be conducted. Although attempts have been made to put rules in place that would cripple me and have been aimed at me, even when such rules would wind up being adopted, I always operated within those rules. I don't make motions to suspend the rules. But if I saw the need to, I would make such a motion. In this instance I'm going to vote to overrule the Chair, because to me germaneness means that the matter to be amended to the main bill is one that has to do with the subject that the main bill deals with. My position is not new to those who've been around here for a while. My student, I have to claim him, "Baron" Tyson, made the comment, one wrong doesn't make a right, 50 wrongs don't make a right. But I got to thinking and applying it to him, one wrong certainly makes a right-winger, and the multitude of wrongs he makes certainly make a very identifiable right-winger. (Laughter.) Now, I listened to Senator Coordsen, I listened to
