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of the Educ...out of the trust fund, but there is no implied obligation as far as increasing school aid or any more General Fund support from the state of Nebraska.

SENATOR STUHR: Not, no.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Okay.

SENATOR STUHR: Not at this time. This bill does not include that. It looks at those funds using and...but I must say that after this year, those funds will certainly be reduced. So it'll be...

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Okay, do you have a rough dollar number on what it is the first year, and then, hereafter, just so...

SENATOR STUHR: Well, of course, it varies. I think it averages about \$10 million, but last year Senator Bohlke took some of that funding for the incentive school bill, 1228; 70 percent, 10 percent, which left the 20 percent that I'm using.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: This year, and what about, what's the approximate amount of the 15 percent then into the future?

SENATOR STUHR: It would probably be a little over a million dollars.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Okay, thank you.

SENATOR STUHR: Okay. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Wehrbein. Further discussion on the Stuhr amendment, Senator Brown, followed by Senator Kiel, Bohlke and Stuhr.

SENATOR BROWN: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, a few years ago I attended a leadership conference and we were all supposed to bring something from our state that...a particularly compelling activity we were doing. Many of the states were doing a lot in welfare reform, and things in corrections, and, actually, Nebraska didn't fill out the appropriate form and didn't have a story to tell. And so we ended up using the story
