People will wring their hands about the people who are addicted to gambling. They get all upset when they find out that there are students on the college campus serving as runners for bookies. Bookies set a line and you gamble on sporting events. That's a terrible thing, when athletes will shave points so that gamblers will have a better chance of winning. That is frowned upon and they talk about how the evils of gambling creep into everything and will spoil whatever it touches. You got Las Vegas, a mecca for gamblers, and then to balance off the country so you won't just have all the wickedness on that side tilting the country into the Pacific Ocean, Senator Cudaback, so that everybody is drowned because God is angry, they say we've got to balance the country so we'll put one on the East Coast, and I think they have one in New Jersey, don't they? So now they got both sides of the country covered. But it's like a carrying rod that you need if you have a bucket over here and a bucket over there and you got to carry them both. You get a carrying rod and you put a bucket on each end and you get under the middle of the rod and carry it on your shoulder. Well, Nebraska is like the carrying rod. Nebraska is in the middle of the country. So all of these people who are going to talk about the fine values of Nebraska, fine rural values, fine Christian values, and here they are promoting gambling, then are going to use the ill-gotten proceeds from gambling to fund education.
