SENATOR SCHIMEK: Okay. And...

SENATOR STUHR: Yes.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: ...and in conjunction with it, I thought that's what we were probably talking about, but...

SENATOR STUHR: Yes.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: ...I want to follow up on something that Senator Wehrbein, I think, was asking in a rhetorical fashion, and that is, how much of this program, or how much of this funding would go to equipment, how much of it would go to things like career preparation? And there's a whole list of things on page 4 of the bill, acquisition of instructional equipment is at the top, but then you have professional development, improvement of career guidance, and on and on. And to me those are all ongoing expenses. The acquisition of instructional equipment might be a one-time shot, perhaps.

SENATOR STUHR: Right. This was just brought so that local... I think we're always wanting schools to have...make local decisions. And what might be a need in one school district might not be the exact need in another school district. So they...the schools will have to make application, they will have to say how the funding is going to be used and then also a follow-up on how it was used.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Okay.

SENATOR STUHR: So it gives some flexibility. The point is they are grants. This has not changed from the original Innovative Grant Fund,...

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Um-hum.

SENATOR STUHR: ...where grants are given to schools.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Okay.

SENATOR STUHR: So we're not changing that concept at all.
