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SENATOR SCHIMEK: Okay, and I...

SENATOR STUHR: They can apply for the need.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Okay, and I would like to ask you one more question, if you know the answer to it, Senator Stuhr. Do you know how much money is in the grant program, approximately, available right now?

SENATOR STUHR: There is, of unobligated funds, \$3.2 million.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: So you're really talking about taking the remainder...

SENATOR STUHR: And that is only a one-time.... Yes, um-hum.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: ...the remainder of that money?

SENATOR STUHR: Yes, that is...

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: One minute.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: So then nothing else...

SENATOR STUHR: Right, that has not...

SENATOR SCHIMEK: ...would be available for anything else?

SENATOR STUHR: No, if you will recall Senator Bohlke's bill last year was 1228, which was...

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Right.

SENATOR STUHR: ...called the School Incentive Fund. That actually takes 70 percent of the grant funds, the mentoring program takes 10 percent of the grant funds. Those were...this is why it is hard for me to understand that now, all of a sudden, we're targeting funds. Yes, we are targeting funds, but they're still targeted to schools, just as Senator Bohlke's bill was.
