we might be able to dismantle the machinery of the lottery. But that has to come later. We will do what we're able to do. This motion is to bracket this bill until a day in January of next year. My aim is to kill the bill. And any of these gambling bills that come before us, Senator Schellpeper can confirm that I have opposed them, even if it does not relate directly to expanding gambling or doing something new with it. If all the bill does is to legalize some activity that currently is illegal, but these gambling outfits are doing it, I vote against those bills, too. I did all I could to destroy horse racing at Ak-Sar-Ben, never have been in favor of it. And I'm not in favor of doing what this bill would do. Whatever the motivation that anybody has for voting for the bracket motion is all right with me. Judgment day is the time to determine people's motives, Senator Kiel and everybody else. I ought to tell a little story, since I've got a minute or two and we're all assembled here together. There was a... Is it all right, if I tell it, Senator Kiel? She said, which one is it? (Laughter.) Well, you know Senator Kiel's first name is Shelley, and she died, as all of us must do. And she was in that line, waiting to enter the pearly gates. And she happened to be behind this nun, who was very, very old, very slow moving. And they all had to sign this book before they could go inside. So, Shelley Kiel was very patient, until she got one person away from the gate and the poor, old nun was standing there just shaking, trying to get her signature on this paper, and she finally said, "St. Peter, I can't wait anymore, I'm impatient, I live right, I want to go on into heaven, I want to try my wings, put on my golden slippers, walk down those streets flowing with milk and honey and so forth." So St. Peter says, "Shelley, I just got one thing to say to you." And she said, "What's that?" He said, (singing) "Wait till the nun signs, Shelley." (Laughter.)
