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students in the vocational technical area. You will see a computer and a lab. You will see students that are working together as a team in the...

SENATOR CROSBY: One minute.

SENATOR STUHR: ...projects, so that is one of the areas when we talk about the high cost. In reality, all students do not seek advanced degrees, but all students do need work skills. And I want to also just mention a little bit about the breakdown of the funding to refresh your memory. For the last five years, 49.5 percent of the 25 percent that has been allotted to the environmental and education funds, this 49 percent of that 25 percent goes to the Education Innovative Fund. Last year we passed a bill that took 80 percent of that funding.

SENATOR CROSBY: Time.

SENATOR STUHR: The remaining 20 percent...thank you.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Stuhr. Discussion on the Stuhr amendment? Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Madam President, members of the Legislature, because Senator Stuhr's amendment is an amendment to an amendment, I cannot do at this point what I intend to do or attempt to do. I am very much opposed to lottery money, period. I'm opposed to a state lottery. What I'm going to try to do if this amendment is adopted, is to strip out of the law every reference to money from the lottery going to any school purpose. It can all go to the Environmental Trust Fund. They can give that percentage to the compulsive gamblers admitting that, by having this state lottery, the state is going to create and exacerbate a serious problem that has been recognized by psychiatrists, psychologists, sociologists and other people concerned about the problems that confront society. So I'm working on an amendment and I'm going to take as much time on that as is needed. And if this amendment of Senator Stuhr is adopted, then I'm going to go after the whole bill, and I'm just making it clear so that nobody will be surprised. Whenever that ugly monster of gambling raises its head, Senator Kremer, I will go after it. And sometimes I'm told that the existing law
