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allows these expenditures of the kind Senator Stuhr is talking about. That may be true, but it has no significance in terms of how I feel about the inappropriateness of those expenditures. So I do not just sit down of an evening, of a night, or of a morning and comb through the statutes to find all of those existing provisions with which I disagree. There are far too many and I would miss some. But whenever it is called to my attention, I'm going to respond to it. The big dragon, the lottery dragon, has laid eggs here, there, and other places that have created, in the minds of some people, an interest in supporting and keeping in existence the state lottery. This is not a goose laying golden eggs. This is a dragon laying noisome eggs. And when the offspring of that dragon come into the world, only harm is done. Nobody can point out a positive good from gambling, nobody. So they want to muddy the water by saying, well, we know it's evil, but look at the good that comes from it. In other words, Senator Kremer, they say the devil brought it but God sent it, and that's how they get, you know, get that stuff straightened out and that's the way religious people always do. They change the meaning of words. They modify their principles. They cause laws that are supposedly written in stone to be converted to rubber and they become very flexible and they fit any and every situation. These deeply religious people will speak against moral relativism, which means that you determine right and wrong based on the exigencies of the moment, on popular opinion at the time, on the fads and fancies of the day, so there is no such thing as a true standard of right and wrong. And when moral relativism comes into play, it is another way of saying that the strong determine what is the law, the powerful will dictate what is right and wrong, and once...

SENATOR CROSBY: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...those determinations have been made the determiners are exempt. They make those rules for others. It's like, Senator Kremer, Jesus said, they bind these grievous burdens, heavy to be borne, and put them on other men's shoulders and they themselves won't touch them with one of their little fingers. That's what we're talking about. So we're in for quite a struggle on this. I'm not through with it by a long shot.
