SENATOR KIEL: Okay, so what you're saying is that money might be available to pay for a per diem for a teacher to go to a training session?

SENATOR STUHR: Yes, possibly...

SENATOR KIEL: Would it be available to pay...

SENATOR STUHR: ...for future update.

SENATOR KIEL: I'm sorry, I said I was going to ask you one question; I've asked several. Would it be available to pay a substitute teacher to take the place of the teacher that's at a training session?

SENATOR STUHR: If the local school...if that's what they desire to use their funding for, from the grant.

SENATOR KIEL: Thank you. Again, these are gambling proceeds that we're talking about. We have been making noises recently about the fact that proceeds from gambling in the state are going down as a result of other competition. It is not a stable source of revenue. We ought not base any kind of ongoing operations in this state on the premise that gambling money will be available to continue to fund it at whatever level we think it ought to be. I believe that we should talk about whether or not we should provide additional funding for vocational education in the state. I think that's a very good public policy discussion. What I do not believe is that we ought to provide for that particular educational purpose with gambling revenue. Thank you.
