SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Stuhr, would you respond?

SENATOR STUHR: Yes, Senator Wehrbein, I did previously have my light on and then took it off because I too thought, well, I'll just listen to see what some others might say. I would support your amendment in the fact that it would be a one-time infusion. It would help particularly in those areas and possibly come back and see what we might do in the future, but I would be supportive of your amendment.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Thank you, Senator Stuhr. I will not have much more to say. I'll ask you to seriously consider this amendment. Thank you.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: You've heard the closing. The question before the body is the adoption of the Wehrbein amendment to the committee amendments. All those in favor vote aye; all those opposed vote nay. Please record.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of Senator Wehrbein's amendment to the committee amendments.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: The amendment is adopted. Next item. We're back to debating the committee amendments. Senator Stuhr.

SENATOR STUHR: Actually, thank you, Mr. Speaker and members of the Legislature. The committee amendments were to appropriate \$4 million from the General Fund, so I believe it would be appropriate to not support that amendment at this time.
