Suddenly he wasn't as stingy and everything was...everything was going now. I never thought I'd see the day when Senator Wehrbein would say on this kind of a situation where we don't have any standards, any guarantees, any clear idea where we're going, just give them that money for one year for whatever reason, then everybody feels good about this bill. **SPEAKER KRISTENSEN:** Senator Wehrbein, would you respond?

**SENATOR CHAMBERS:** Senator Wehrbein, is there any specification as to how this money that your amendment provides must be spent?

**SENATOR WEHRBEIN:** Would you repeat it again, Senator? I was...

**SENATOR CHAMBERS:** Oh, that's all right.

**SENATOR WEHRBEIN:** ...interrupted.

**SENATOR CHAMBERS:** Okay. Is there any specification as to how this money your amendment will provide must be spent...

**SENATOR CHAMBERS:** And if, with the expenditure of this money, let's contrive an ideal utopian situation where great things begin to develop, they've got to come to a halt, don't they, if they're going to rely on the money that the Legislature is so freely giving under this bill?
