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SENATOR CHAMBERS: If it were not for this bill, would this committee be brought into existence?

SENATOR STUHR: This was an opportunity to bring this into existence.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And my time is up. Thank you.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, when a bill is put together piecemeal like this to make somebody feel good it comes out making no sense. It doesn't to me. And my colleagues are going to go along and say we're going to do this and set up this committee to do all this advising about nothing. After this one-time expenditure, it's over. But you're going to create a brand new bureaucracy, which I've heard my colleagues whine and whine about over and over and over, talking about reducing the size of government, stop mandating this and mandating that, and now you're creating an entire bureaucracy when you're going to spend money one time. And if the money is not utilized for the purposes stipulated under subsection (4) of Section 4 of this act, that money shall be reallocated for distribution as provided under subsections (2) and (3) of Section 4 of this act in the following school fiscal year. And when you look at subsection (4), it's talking about numerous feel good activities. Look at them: leadership and support services; talking about trends and requirements of business and industry. These "leadership support services include, but are not limited to: career guidance and counseling; curriculum development and dissemination; integration of academic and career preparation" and so forth. Now the money is supposed to be used for those purposes, if I understand it, and any money not used for those purposes has to be reallocated, so you're limited in this bill to expending money for the things found in subsection (4) which is on page 3. Look at what the money is limited to being spent for. And if you don't spend it for those purposes, it has to be reallocated. That's what the bill says. So I'm going to offer some amendments of my own so I can at least get some things into the record. Then, as we get into some of the heavy lifting bills, I want to see if you feel
