\$60,000 left, that could be used in other...for other grants. And so, we...that was the best way to state that in order for us to target the 3.2 for this grant.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Senator Stuhr.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Stuhr.

SENATOR STUHR: I stand actually in opposition to Senator Chambers' motion and the fact that we are looking at the unobligated funding running up until June 30th of this year, and those funds then could be used for the following school year, leaving then, since we have removed the 15 percent, we would start out with the following year then with...leaving those funds for the Educational Innovative Fund. Thank you.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Speaker and members of the Legislature, I believe we need to think about what it is that we're doing. And what my amendment would do is to give us time to think about it. You can still do Senator Stuhr a favor.... Oh, Senator Bohlke is gone. Oh, Senator Bohlke is there. Senator Bohlke, you can still do Senator Stuhr a favor, Squire Wehrbein can do her a favor, and all the others who have been speaking in support of this bill can do her a favor. A bill with her name on it will pass, but it will not take effect, in terms of money actually being expended until the year...the school year 2000-2001. That gives the opportunity for us to think coolly, calmly and carefully. Senator Stuhr said that she has been trying to write this bill, or tried to have it written in a way that would accommodate the amount of money in that fund. Based on the calculations of those with whom she discussed it, \$60,000 will be there in excess of \$3,200,000. I think you ought to say what you mean. And, if she doesn't, then I'm going to strike that \$3,200,000, and I'm also going to strike "up to", and I'm going to put a precise amount in there. And that amount is going to be \$2.37. I'm going to find out just how much money Senator Stuhr wants. She won't say a flat \$3,200,000, so we need to create some brackets. We need the outer limits, and the inner limit. The inner will be the \$2.37. If she agrees that that meets her purpose, we will save a large amount of money, over
