SENATOR DIERKS: That's what makes it unconstitutional.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: I wasn't under the impression that Initiative 300 made it unconstitutional for packers, I mean it doesn't make it unconstitutional for packers to feed...

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: One minute.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: ...cattle, does it?

SENATOR DIERKS: Yes, it does.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: All right. I'll review that. If I can direct your attention to Section 7, page 3, is there any...it says it shall be unlawful for a packer to purchase or enter into a contract to purchase swine to pay or enter into a contract to pay different prices to the sellers of the swine. I don't find, as I read the bill quickly, any frame of reference. A year apart? Two days apart? What's the applicable time line for when you have to pay the same price?

SENATOR DIERKS: I think that it's the same day.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: Shouldn't we say...should we say that...

SENATOR DIERKS: Well, (inaudible).

SENATOR BRASHEAR: ...it's within a 24-hour period or whatever? 'Cause the way I read it, it sounds like you could never, ever...

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Time.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: ...pay.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Senator Raikes, followed by Senator Beutler, and then Senator Bromm.

SENATOR RAIKES: Thank you, Mr. President, members. To continue on for just a second, I was talking before about market information. I simply wanted to make the point that it turns
