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SENATOR DIERKS: I just think that's the way it ought to be, Senator Hilgert.

SENATOR HILGERT: Well, you know what I'm getting at, "Cap"?

SENATOR DIERKS: I know what you're getting at.

SENATOR HILGERT: Thanks.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I am in support of Senator Beutler's amendment, and I'd like to say to my young friend Senator John Hilgert, he is learning, he is applying parliamentary tactics in a very effective manner, and some people may not be totally aware of what's happening, but he is what would have been called in the old days a bushwhacker. You lie in the bushes under cover, and when your quarry unsuspectingly comes within range, you draw down on him or her and they're gone. You erase them. Senator Hilgert has not quite done that but I think it is good, from time to time, for us to be reminded that we, on the floor of the Legislature, represent diverse interests, and sometimes divergent interests. Very little can one of us do alone. Now I'm suppose to be that powerhouse, Senator Redfield, but I'm only one vote. See, I never forget that. Other people, editorial writers, and those outside the Chamber, forget it, but I don't. So there come times when we are very concerned about something that pertains to or will impact on the constituency we represent, we cannot be so myopic that we do not realize that others may feel similarly situated relative to their constituents. So what Senator Hilgert has done, instead of taking a machete and chopping off ears, noses, arms and other extremities, he just took a little needle, which he sterilized, and inserted it just enough to remind a person that there are more currents in this stream of legislation. And for that, I kind of compliment Senator Hilgert, I'm proud of him. He's not in the culture corner yet but he's kind of in the suburban area, and should we have to eject anybody, he will be first in line. What Senator Beutler's amendment is doing is showing that this is a serious bill, that the intent is to really do something at the state level which is of substance. We all know that this bill cannot solve all of
