things back down to earth where people actually live, where those who are producing these animals have to try to survive, and what you all are talking about is not bearing on that specifically. So it was not the kind of meeting where all those interests were forthcoming, and two or three of them would just kind of sit back, watching, listening, waiting. It was not, brothers and sisters, the kind of thing you would expect to have at a good old-fashioned revival hour where we are all trying to help each other save our souls so that we can march on up the king's highway. So I do not expect those interests to just keep their hands off this bill unless they're sure that we mean what it is we're doing. Now I know some form of this bill is going to pass. If they try to mess with it, I'm going to change or attempt to change the penalty provisions that Senator Beutler put in to alter that penalty for deliberate false reporting from a Class IV misdemeanor to a Class I felony. Some people don't know what that is but that's a bit more serious. And I...

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...think it would catch the attention of anybody who faced it. So, Senator Dierks, if you get wind of anything, Deacon Jones, if you get wind of anything, Senator Vrtiska, or anybody else who has been working on this bill, let me know. You all can keep your hands clean but I love to deal with those big shots, those stuffed shirts, the ones who like to intimidate and bully and take advantage of those who cannot defend and protect themselves. A producer may not be able to do anything out there in the countryside, but we have long, strong arms and very strong steel-like fingers in the Legislature when we decide to take hold of a miscreant's throat and squeeze the life out of him or her or them or they. So I'm glad that we're in such a collegial mood this morning and the bill will move. And, Senator Dierks, I want to say again that...
