SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay. Now if the manufacturer saw a way to take some kind of action to reduce the cost of these raw materials and these actions could be taken either within the law or outside the law without...

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...any punishment, would a manufacturer be likely to take those actions to lower the cost of this raw material?

SENATOR RAIKES: Well, yeah, he would...he would be likely or "incented" to do so, at least, because it would lead to increased profits for his operation.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I have to turn my light on again.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Vrtiska, you're recognized on the advancement of LB 835.

SENATOR VRTISKA: Thank you, Mr. Lieutenant Governor. I certainly rise for the purpose of adding my support to LB 835. I did appreciate Senator Chambers analogy or interpretation of the meeting and also Senator Dierks's discussion about the meeting that was held. One thing I thought was interesting was how sometimes things can get moved away from the subject at hand and become so distorted that they become difficult to understand. Nobody has ever accused me of being the brightest man on this floor, don't match wits with Senator Chambers and several other of the senators, obviously, but I thought about, as Senator Chambers was talking, I was...as many of you know, just over to Europe, and my daughter gave a talk before medical people over there. The discussion they held was so far above me that I never did figure out what they were talking about, and that's kind of where I got with the discussion that Senator Chambers was talking about when we were discussing this issue with the meat packers and the producers. It got so far off that I wasn't able to understand exactly what was happening, and why. There was only one thing that I could really understand and I understand that today. If you produce something and sell it for less than it cost you, you're not going to make any money.
