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SENATOR PREISTER: The other question I would ask you, Senator Chambers, would you like the remainder of my time.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes.

SENATOR PREISTER: You may have it.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Mr. President and members...

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...members of the Legislature, I do want some things in the record because Nebraska's action is going to have significance. People outside this state may wonder what we were talking about, what we were thinking about when we enacted this legislation. And I think we should help compile a record which is clear and that people outside of Nebraska may be able to understand. So I'm trying to use some examples that people who might be from the city, as I am, can grasp, and then by way of analogy apply it to agricultural matters about which we don't know as much as others who are more directly involved in this situation. But in responding or discussing some of the things Senator Cudaback brought up, I am always working for an ideal world. I am just realistic enough to know that it will never be achieved, but if a target is a great way off and you're going to use a bow and arrow to try to strike that target, you don't hold the bow and arrow on a line parallel to the ground and hope that you're going to have enough power in pulling that string back and bending the bow to propel the arrow all the way to the target. So you elevate the bow so that the arrow will fly in an arc. It goes up, gains momentum, but as it loses momentum and comes down, it is going to go a greater distance and you have a better chance of striking the target. We often must aim higher than we expect to strike in order to strike that which we're aiming at. If we constantly look at the goobers, if we constantly look at the roots and the bushes, we will never even be aware that there is such a thing as a tree. So we have to expand our scope. We have to broaden our horizon so that we can grasp the significance of passing legislation like this aimed at addressing a problem which is beyond our power to completely solve. But we're in a position to provide the mode of force to others who will join in, be emboldened and encouraged to take a
