discussion to compile a record is a poor use of our legislative time. I don't know of an issue that will have more import to the people to be affected. There will be bills more controversial but not more significant in its impact. And it's kind of interesting that although there has not been direct opposition expressed, there has been so much discussion, mainly from me, that I do think the packers and others have to realize that we understand what it is that is going on. Senator Kerrey, U.S. Senator Kerrey was of the opinion that legislation by steps...by states can help encourage Congress to do something. But even if that were not the case, we have an obligation, as a Legislature, to do that which we have the power to do, and I believe that's what we are aiming at here today. Later on, if Senator Raikes and I decide that we need to discuss anything on the floor, we would do so on Select File, but I'm available to anybody who would want to talk to me, even the lobbyists for Jesse James, Frank James, Cole Younger and Quantrill if they want to talk about this matter. We don't want to conceal anything. We want every question that people have to be brought out and spread on the record and addressed. I don't think anybody can say there was not the opportunity for all matters to be discussed. If the packers, the processors and whoever else is out there that may be worried about this bill or have questions about it want to raise those questions, they ought to do so or forever hold their peace. After this bit of time of mine runs out, I will not say anything else on the bill while we're on Final Reading, and that probably means we will...I meant on General File, we will get a vote and move the bill. If I have made any comments that my colleagues found to be unclear, you can talk to me off the floor and I will further elaborate. I don't want, on this particular issue, there to be any questions left hanging. I listened to Senator Dierks responding to questions. I've listened as Senator Vrtiska deprecated him...let me change that word, he says he is so lacking in understanding he won't know what I'm talking about. I've listened to Senator Vrtiska underestimate his knowledge and understanding of what it is we're dealing with. But when you put it all together, everybody, even those who ask questions, have contributed something that I think fleshes out the record and makes clear what this Legislature is doing, that we're aware of what we're doing, and when we cast a vote, the vote is done with full knowledge of the significance of that vote.
