the administration of the bill, the bureaucracy that is created, and the way we will be using law enforcement personnel in the administration of this bill. I mean, how are they going to handle all of the paperwork and all of the investigation and all of the research they're going to have to do in order to make this bill go? But, for now, I'm not going to talk about some of my problems with the bill. Rather, I'm going to read to you just a couple of excerpts from a couple of constituents of mine who have written in pleading that we not adopt LB 476. One of them is a neighbor of mine. I've known her for many, many, many years. Her son and my son, sons, were in Eagle...or in Boy Scouts together. He son went on to become an Eagle Scout and she lives in my neighborhood and she says this about this bill. She said: where will these concealed weapons be stored? Of course, on the top shelf, in quotes, out of sight and unloaded, in quotes. She says, we carry a deep sadness of the death of a child in my cousin's family in the fifties. The three-year-old climbed up to reach the, quote, stored, unloaded, unquote, handgun that her daddy used for hunting and accidentally killed her brother. That is the only...that is only the by-product of the presence of a gun.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: One minute.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: She goes on to say, and I will turn my light on again, I can't imagine walking on the Rock Island bike trail and not knowing how many people could be carrying guns that are concealed legally. I mentioned this letter to some constituents of Senator Maurstad one day. They were actually school children, and their response was, well, she could carry a gun, and (laugh) I was appalled at that kind of thinking, that the way to prevent the fear on the bike trail is to arm everybody. I just...I mean this woman has probably never held a gun in her life and she is not about to start now. What she will do is she will stay home, she will not use the bike trail, at least until her fears are satisfied. I can't tell you how strongly...

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Time.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: ...I'm opposed to this bill and I will be here again.
