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people like that, well, I would...I would suspect and I would hope that our primary law enforcement agency, which is the State Patrol, would not use those type of discriminatory tactics.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: But if the State Patrol has been shown to target people who are not white based on a profiling, how can we be sure that they're not going to decide that these kind of people should not have the right to carry these concealed weapons? There's nothing in the bill to guard against that, is there?

SENATOR JANSSEN: No, but you can always have an appeal. You can appeal that decision to deny a permit.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: But how can you appeal if there are no standards, because when you bring the appeal you don't have anything to base it on? Why cannot...why were not standards put in here,...

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: One...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...if you know?

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: ...minute.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Because the State Patrol would promulgate the rules for the...under the bill for the application process.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Senator Janssen.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Those are all the questions I'll ask you at this point...

SENATOR JANSSEN: All right.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...and I will put on my light again.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Further discussion? Senator Janssen. Senator Janssen, you're recognized...
