SENATOR JANSSEN: I'm sorry, Mr. Lieutenant Governor.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: ...on the amendment.

SENATOR JANSSEN: I did not...I did not hear you call my name. I was talking to someone here.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: I'm sorry.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Well, I would, you know, Senator Chambers, I, you know, with the amendment you're proposing as the \$500 fee, I'm just afraid that that would be a little bit too much. What we were trying to do with the \$100 fee was come as close to making this bill revenue neutral as we could, and with \$500 I'm afraid that you would have too many people who are possibly now are carrying a concealed weapon and would like to carry that concealed weapon under this provision, and they would...they would think \$500 is too much. So I'm going to continue what I'm doing right now and that would alleviate that person from having the training and so on that would go with this. Some of those...some of those things that are in that training, of course, one of them deals with how to diffuse a situation that you come upon and I'll go through these if people will bear with me. This is on page 13, starting on line 15: Knowledge and safe handling of a handgun; knowledge and safe handling of the ammunition; safe handling...or safe handgun shooting fundamentals; live shooting of a handgun on a firing range and the demonstration of competency with a handgun with respect to minimum standards; identification of ways to develop and maintain handgun shooting skills; knowledge of federal, state, and local laws pertaining to the purchase, ownership, transportation, use, possession of a handgun; knowledge of federal, state, and local laws pertaining to the use of a handgun for self-defense; knowledge of the ways to avoid a criminal attack and to diffuse or control a violent confrontation; and knowledge and proper storage practice of handguns and ammunition, which I think is very important. It's very important to the fact that Senator Schimek alluded to. Including the storage practices that reduce the possibility of accidental injury to a child. Handgun training and safety courses shall provide an opportunity for the applicant to
