qualify in all of the categories of a handgun listed in the subdivision. Those are just some of the...some of the things, and actually, you know, I guess that...that if you...we talk about discrimination, would the fact that someone could not get \$500, would that be discriminating against a person with...without monetary funds to pur...or to apply for their permit? All these things come into my...and we talk about a flood, a flood of concealed weapons that would happen with this bill. Well, I ask you, how do we, you know, how do we really know how many handguns are out there right now? We really don't know that. And at least...at least with a person applying for a permit that person has to take the training, some of the things that I have aforementioned, about how to handle the guns, storage, so on and so forth. Senator Kiel, I didn't...I didn't quite hear all of your...all of your issues you were talking about, but...

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: One minute.

SENATOR JANSSEN: ...you were talking about...I thought I heard you say something about the teachers would be carrying handguns into the classroom. No, the bill does not allow a handgun to be on any school grounds or in a school. That...that is in the bill. Right now, I don't know who carries one into the school grounds. You don't know. This...hopefully, no one, but it could be done now. Those things aren't going to change. At least you have an idea of who has some of the weapons. Hopefully, in a perfect world, everyone would have to go through this that carries a handgun, a concealed handgun. They should have this training. They should know how to handle the weapon. They should know how to diffuse the situation that you come up against. These are all things that are taken into consideration when you apply for...
