SENATOR CHAMBERS: Let's say that a different way instead of expose yourself.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Well, no, no, no. Now...

SENATOR JANSSEN: Um-hum.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Your gun is loaded. You're pointing the gun at the design target. Do you now squeeze the trigger to propel that projectile on its way into the design target? Is that the next step?

SENATOR JANSSEN: If the situation is critical enough.
