In addition, it says that if the State Patrol does deny the application, then the State Patrol has to notify the applicant in writing by stating the grounds and informing the applicant of his right to a hearing. So then they have to set up a hearing process in addition. The bill goes on and on. It talks about all the stuff that the Patrol has to do; if a licensee wants to renew their license they have to go through all of this again. They have to check with all these sources again. And it is very much a very complicated, bureaucratic procedure. And I would submit to you that the Patrol probably needs the \$500 to carry out the provisions...

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Time.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: ...of this act.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Schimek. Further discussion on the Chambers amendment? Senator Janssen.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Thank you, Mr. Lieutenant Governor, members of the Legislature. I believe that the \$500 fee, being as we are on this section of the divisible part of the committee amendments, I believe that it is way too high. Last year, or two years ago, when this bill was introduced, the fee was at \$75. We're adding 25 percent more to that fee right now. And I believe that that is being very frugal. We are trying to not go overboard on this. We're trying to accommodate those people who feel as though they definitely do need to apply for a permit. And it doesn't make them too restrictive. I certainly, certainly would not...hate to discriminate against someone just for the simple reason that they do not have \$500. I don't think \$100, in this day and age, is that hard to come by. We can find \$100 for a lot of other things. And if someone really feels as though they need to have this legislation or they need to have the right to carry, \$100 is not too much. You're talking...\$500, I think, is going to be restrictive, and it is in some cases an insurmountable amount of cash to dig up. So I just, with that, I will be opposing the Chambers amendment to this section of the committee amendments. Thank you for the time, Mr. Speaker.
