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SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...of the law,...

SENATOR TYSON: They are not breaking the law, they...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...hidden in their clothes,...

SENATOR TYSON: ...are carrying that gun under the provisions of state law 28-1202.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And what does that law...what does that say, Senator Tyson?

SENATOR TYSON: That allows them the affirmative defense, if an ordinary, reasonable and prudent man feels that he has cause to arm himself.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And that's the law that your constituents are complying with when they carry a gun, hidden in their clothes, right now?

SENATOR TYSON: Assuming any of my constituents are carrying a gun.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Then why do we need this bill? 'Cause they can do it under the law right now, and you said they're doing it, what do we need this bill for?

SENATOR TYSON: That law is not transportable.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: (Laugh.) That doesn't make sense, but my time is up. (Laugh.)

SENATOR TYSON: It's good for...it's...

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Time. Senator Kiel, you're recognized next on the Chambers amendment.

SENATOR KIEL: Thank you, Mr. Lieutenant Governor, members of the Legislature. I rise in support again of increasing the cost of a license to carry a concealed weapon, and want to speak to another aspect of the whole bill, which relates to why I think
