mentioned, but I don't believe this is the time or the place to do that. We are on the committee amendments and the first division is the fees, so I'd like to stick with them and, in my opinion, the \$100 fee will take care of what we anticipate the application process will be. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Janssen. Senator Chambers, would you like to close on your amendment?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes, I would, Mr. President. This amount is reasonable. Senator Janssen thinks that \$100 is enough. The amendment before us is the committee amendment. This is something the committee put into the bill, not I, said the fly. I'd like to ask Senator Janssen a question.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Janssen, could you yield?

SENATOR JANSSEN: Certainly.
