SENATOR JANSSEN: That's right.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And you decided that what Senator Schellpeper had...had drafted was not adequate to the purpose in terms of the amount of this fee.

SENATOR JANSSEN: That's right, after I had got a report back from the Fiscal Office on what they anticipated this would be.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: The Fiscal Office of the Legislature, or whoever does the fiscal calculating for the State Patrol?

SENATOR JANSSEN: No, that was...I think it was the Fiscal Office of the Legislature, Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Are any of those people trained in law enforcement, as far as you know?

SENATOR JANSSEN: Not to my knowledge.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Well, on what did they base their determination that this \$100 fee is going to be adequate to do all of the things that this bill requires of the Patrol?

SENATOR JANSSEN: Well, on the amount of estimated applications that would be...that there would be.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Did they determine that, or did the Patrol give, if you know now, did the Patrol give Fiscal information on which they could base the determination that \$100 is the appropriate amount for this fee,...

SENATOR JANSSEN: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...if you know?

SENATOR JANSSEN: I don't know for sure, Senator "Shambers", but I...Chambers, Senator Chambers,...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: That's all right.
