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SENATOR JANSSEN: ...but I would imagine that is who they went to to base their opinion.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: When the...when people's voice become a little mushy, I'm overcoming, I'm winning. Now the calculation of how many are likely to apply is based on what, if you know?

SENATOR JANSSEN: Would you repeat that again. I didn't hear you.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: All right. An estimate has been made of how many people are likely to apply for these permits to carry a concealed weapon.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: On what is that estimate based, if you know?

SENATOR JANSSEN: I would imagine they had looked at other states and used the population of the other states and compared to the population of this state and a percentage of the general population, such as like Wyoming doesn't have as many people as we do so they only had 5,000 applications to...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: But if the people in Wyoming are not as terror-stricken as Nebraskans, that might have something to do with it also, might it not?

SENATOR JANSSEN: Well, I think...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: The people in Nebraska are terror-stricken. They're terrified of being killed in their beds at night, aren't they?

SENATOR JANSSEN: I don't know. I'm not.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: If this estimate of the number is incorrect, if it is too low,...

SENATOR JANSSEN: Um-hum.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...then more money will come in than was
