SENATOR JANSSEN: Right.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...that right.

SENATOR JANSSEN: That's right.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: But those who support this bill want to keep the estimate low...

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...because they don't want to make it seem like everybody's going to go out and be carrying these guns. Isn't that true?

SENATOR JANSSEN: No, I think that the estimate is awfully high. I don't believe that you will have that many applicants.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Then if you think that the estimate is high and you won't have that many applicants, then the \$100 is not going to bring in as much money as was calculated. Isn't that true?

SENATOR JANSSEN: That's true, but you wouldn't have to have as many applications to process either, Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: But you would still have to set up certain bureaucratic structures no matter how many or few will be making this application.

SENATOR JANSSEN: That's true.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And that's going to take money.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Um-hum.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And if there's not enough money there then the bill cannot be implemented in the way that's anticipated. Isn't that true?
