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SENATOR JANSSEN: That's correct.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: So we...unless we change that we'll continue to be short every year and it says that we're going to have to supplement this with General Funds or another source of revenue. Now, that's just presuming that we have 19,500 applications and 5,000 renewals every year. If it falls short of that we're going to fall even shorter in terms of money.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Senator, can I answer?

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Yes, please do.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Senator Schimek, that was...I think it was between 8 and 9 thousand, not 19 thousand applicants.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: It says 19,500.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Nineteen thousand five hundred?

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Yes.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Maybe...maybe I'm wrong then.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: And five thousand in each subsequent year. You know, and I'm...

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: One minute.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: ...not going to argue with that 19,500.

SENATOR JANSSEN: That is...that is for three years. That is for three years, Senator Schimek. That license lasts for three years.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Correct.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Um-hum.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: It does last for three years, but it says the Patrol estimates first year applications of 19,500 and 5,000 in
