SENATOR RAIKES: Thank you, Mr. President, members of the Legislature. Senator Janssen, I would like to address a question to you, if I might.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Janssen, would you yield to Senator Raikes?

SENATOR JANSSEN: Yes.

SENATOR RAIKES: Thank you, Senator. I'm looking at the green copy, Section 21, and I would just like to read that to you quickly: Nebraska State Patrol shall maintain a listing of all licensees and any pertinent information regarding issued licenses. The information shall be available on request to all federal, state, and local law enforcement agencies. Information relating to an applicant or to a licensee received or maintained pursuant to Section 6 of this act by this Nebraska State Patrol
