Nebraska State Patrol station or office; a detention facility; a prison or a jail; a courtroom or a building which contains a courtroom; a polling place during a bona fide election. Does that mean we have to have people at each polling place to make sure that everyone checks their gun at the polling place? A meeting of the governing body of a county, public school district, municipality, or other political subdivision. Who's going to enforce that? Who's going to be at the door to make sure that guns don't go in to these particular meetings? A meeting of the Legislature or a committee of the Legislature; a financial institution; a professional, semiprofessional, or collegiate athletic event. Who's going to check on all of these guns at the door? A school, school grounds, school-owned vehicle or school-sponsored activity. Does this mean that we have to have somebody at the state basketball tournaments to check to see if people got concealed weapons on them when they come into those events? A place of worship; an emergency room or trauma center; a political rally or fund-raiser; a portion of an establishment, and I think there's...there's an amendment for this later on, but a portion of an establishment which is primarily devoted to the sale of alcohol for consumption on the premises; a place where the profession (sic) or carrying of a firearm is prohibited by state or federal law; or place where the person, persons, entity, or entities in control of the property have prohibited licensees from carrying concealed handguns onto the premises. And then there's another whole section about businesses that choose to keep handguns out of their businesses and how you go about doing that. My question is, who's going to enforce this? Who's going to be at the door to check the guns in all these public places? Is it going to be the State Patrol? Is that going to be another one of their duties? I think what I heard from one of the law enforcement agencies earlier today...

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: One minute.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: ...and they talked about people breaking the law, under this particular act might be even greater than people breaking the law right now. I think very well could be, because I don't believe we're going to check at the door of all these public events. I think that people are going to be carrying.
