SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...bluff; that I cannot and will not carry through on things. But I'm going to go to the Clerk's Office and I'm going to get that list of lobbyists and their principals. Ordinarily, I don't even pay attention to that because I have no reason to. Doesn't even mean anything to me. But this time they've crossed a line and I accept the challenge. Senator Ray Janssen, this doesn't involve you at all what I'm talking about, and it doesn't involve any of those senators whose name will happen to appear on this bill. This is "extralegislativ", in the sense of extrajudicial. It's outside the pale. It's something different.
