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when they are excited or angry. And another person said: I'm very concerned about the bill that has been introduced to allow citizens to carry concealed weapons. I'm a retired business owner. However, I still have to travel extensively attending to business matters. In the past year alone, I have been the recipient of two road rage incidents. The present bill, as proposed, does not take into consideration what might happen to people such as me if the driver of a vehicle loses his cool and is carrying a weapon. If he doesn't like the way I'm driving, I could become his target. There is no way a background check will ever uncover a potential road rage driver. These things happen spontaneously. In addition, if the bill passes, a lot of people will probably either forget or pay no attention to the limitations of the bill and carry guns. Guns belong in the hands of law enforcement people and not in the hands of ordinary citizens. let's let police officers determine when the use of a weapon is appropriate. And I'm sure a lot of people disagree with that last paragraph. Also like to read from a very, very excellent letter to the editor in the Lincoln Journal Star recently which talks about this law and says that one of the troubling things about it is those with a criminal history, including violence, would be granted a license after three years from the date of completion of their sentence, or the date their record was sealed or expunged. There could not be a local decision to deny a license. In other words, if the city of Lincoln did not want concealed carry, we don't have any choice. We have to have it under this particular...

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: One minute.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: ...legislation. Also, these licenses would be for...he goes on: These licenses would be for private individuals to carry concealed handguns in areas such as shopping senators (sic), restaurants, theaters, vehicles, vehicles and all parking areas and while walking on the street. This bill is...is very troubling. I don't know if it could ever be amended to not be troubling, but one of the things that I think it does, as illustrated by this particular individual, is it takes away for the...the ability of people to decide at the local level whether they want to have these kinds of provisions in their city.
