SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I'm opposed to Senator Tyson's amendment. When this bill was up for hearing, we had people who were very familiar with the grand jury law, the grand jury system, how it operates. This language serves no meaningful purpose. It was stricken and I see no need to reinstate it, so I'm opposed to Senator Tyson's amendment or motion to return the bill. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Chambers. There are no other lights. Senator Tyson, you're recognized. Senator Tyson waives closing. Question before us is the motion to return LB 72 to Select File. Those in favor vote aye; those opposed nay. Senator Tyson, are you trying to get my attention? Please record.

CLERK: 7 ayes, 23 nays on the motion to return, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: The question is not agreed to. Mr. Clerk. Members, we are on Final Reading. If you could please return to your seats. Members, if you could please return to your desks. Would unauthorized personnel please leave the floor. Thank you. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Read LB 72 on Final Reading.)

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall the bill pass with the emergency clause attached? Those in favor vote aye; those opposed nay. Please record.

CLERK: (Record vote read, Legislative Journal page 1217.)
43 ayes, 2 nays, 4 excused not voting, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: The bill is passed. Mr. Clerk, LB 194.

CLERK: Mr. President, 194. Senator Wickersham, I have a motion from you, Senator, to return 194 for AM0869. (See Legislative Journal page 1103.)
