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type; that this reflects only one weapon at a time?

SENATOR JANSSEN: I'd certainly look at that.

SENATOR HILGERT: Okay, thank you very much.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Time. Senator Schimek.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Yes, thank you, Mr. President, members of the body, and, Senator Janssen, I'd like to follow up with that just a little bit. Senator Hilgert's questions I was also going to try to address because I had a call from his constituent as well. And in the bill, correct me if I'm wrong, there's four different kinds of handguns that you can be certified for. Is that correct?

SENATOR JANSSEN: What page are you on, Senator?

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Well, I'm on page 2, actually, where it says "handgun means" on line 15, and then it goes on down to line 18 and it says, "The following categories of handguns are established", and it says...there's two different types of semiautomatic pistols and then there's a couple of nonsemiautomatic revolvers, and I don't know the difference in any of those so I'm going to ask you to explain them a minute, but it keeps referring to handgun. It doesn't talk about plurals. But I think that Senator Hilgert has raised an interesting question. If you're certified to carry a semiautomatic pistol of a .380 caliber or greater, can you carry multiples? And I...I guess my take on this is that you can only be certified for one category, is that correct, unless you take training in certification for the other category?

SENATOR JANSSEN: I believe so. Well, all right, the categories that are listed?

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Yes.

SENATOR JANSSEN: No, those categories, Senator, are a semiautomatic pistol still requires to pull the trigger every time you want it to fire. All right?
