SENATOR SCHIMEK: Would you...I'm sorry, I'm having a hard time hearing you, Senator. Would you say that again.

SENATOR JANSSEN: A semiautomatic pistol, doesn't make any difference what caliber it is, still requires you, it may be automatic, but it requires you to pull the trigger each time you want it to fire, all right, and a nonsemiautomatic pistol requires you to cock the hammer back and fire a round each time. It is not automatic. You have to...in each...in each case, you still have to pull the trigger one time to fire one projectile.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: But in...in both cases, no matter which one it is, you can load that pistol with more than one round of ammunition, I mean more than one bullet.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Oh, absolutely.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: They're multiple. Okay. Now am I correct in assuming that when you are certified you are certified on your certificate somewhere as only being authorized to carry this one particular kind of handgun?

SENATOR JANSSEN: I believe so, but I'll find out for sure.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Okay. And then I think Senator Hilgert question needs to be addressed. Can you...I mean I don't know why anybody would ever want to carry multiple handguns, but I suppose it's possible, but I don't know that the bill really addresses that. So, with that, thank you, Senator Janssen.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Um-hum.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: I appreciate the information. Another couple of things that I wanted to mention and this same constituent of Senator Hilgert's said that according to the Nebraska Crime Commission statistics, 5,000...501 cars were stolen in 1997. She goes on to say, if those cars had any concealed weapons, they would be in the hands of criminals. So she thinks this is just one more way for criminals to get guns. In addition, I had...
