SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: One minute.

SENATOR BEUTLER: On the spot, feeling intimidated, you got to decide whether...whether it is necessary for the purpose of protecting himself against the use of unlawful force by such other person on the present occasion. Two, the use of such force is not justifiable under this section to resist an arrest which the actor knows is being made by a police officer although the unrest is unlawful...even though the arrest is unlawful. Three, the use of such force is not justifiable under this section to resist force used by the occupier or possessor of property, or by another person on his behalf, where the actor knows that the person using the force is doing so under a claim of right to protect the property, except that this limitation shall not apply if, here we got (a), (b), (c), the actor is a public officer acting in the performance of his duties, or a person lawfully assisting him therein, or a person making or assisting in a lawful arrest; or (d)...

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Time. Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, the senators don't even know what is in that law. Prosecutors don't know what is in that law. Police officers don't know. Yet, we're being asked to presume that these lunatics who want to be hiding these guns in their clothes are going to know more about the law than people trained in the law. But here's one thing which is a general principle when you're applying the law of self-defense. If you are attacked, you are justified in stopping that attack and repelling the attacker. Once you render that attacker incapable of harming you, you must stop. If you go further, you become the aggressor and you are the one who is committing the crime. For example, if an individual is approaching you with a stick and begins to lather you about the head and shoulders with the stick and you disarm that person and knock that person to the ground, then you take that stick and do to him or her what was done to you, you become the criminal. You are committing the crime. Most people don't know that. They have so much of this eye for an eye and a tooth for a tooth nonsense that they would be put in a position to violate the law without knowing that's what they're doing. Senator Hilgert
