SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Janssen.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Thank you, Mr. Speaker, members of the Legislature. The question was asked and I said I would find out about how many guns you can carry. On page 2, line 5, it says a license to carry a... "a" concealed handgun. It doesn't say concealed handguns. It says a concealed handgun. Now that, to me, that means one. That's singular; it's not plural. Those who were concerned about that, you can look that up and see where you're at. And, again, with the... when we were talking about all of the people who were going to jump on the bandwagon and go get the training, carry the concealed weapons, let me ask you again how many people do you think there are carrying concealed handguns now? If someone has that figure, if they can get a count somewhere, I'd like to... I really would like to see that. I don't know where they would... I don't know where you'd find it unless you just ran a check and stopped everyone on the street in every one of our towns, villages and cities across the state and run a check and added them all up at the end of the day or the end of the week and see how many people were carrying them. But what would happen then? They would probably be arrested because cannot carry concealed handguns. Only the ones who had that handgun on the outside of their clothing were the ones who would be legally carrying a handgun. And I... and actually the only difference, I mean look at it this way, the only difference, when you see a car coming down the road now, if that person has a handgun in their, in their possession, and he lays that handgun on the seat, he's not violating any laws. It's not concealed. The only difference is if this bill were to pass the man would be driving down the... driving down the street with the handgun laying on the seat and he could have a newspaper over the top of it, the only difference. Same gun, same car, same person, except... except if the man has the... who has the concealed weapon, if this bill passes, will at least have some instruction on to... on the way to handle that gun. That will be the only difference. And the same thing holds true with the person who wears a gun on the outside of his clothing now. Same thing holds true. If the bill passes, the man will be able to put it inside of his jacket or any pocket, lady can put it in her purse, and they will not be in violation of the
