kids. They think these things over and then they decide to take care of matters with pistols and rifles. You could spend a long time trying to figure out, you know, why individual kids do this, but the real common thread is that kids see this way, see using guns and violence, as a way to get rid of their problem and to get rid of other people, and this will continue to happen. And this is the message that we send with a bill like this, is that the answer is to use a gun or to commit some act of violence to solve their problems. Finally, something we have touched upon a couple times but I want to reiterate it, law enforcement is opposed to this. This bill represents a very schizophrenic viewpoint. On the one hand, many of you, my colleagues, present yourselves as tough on crime, pro law and order. Except here, where law enforcement says this would put us in danger, you have turned a deaf ear to them and I ask you to no longer do that. Thank you.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Hilgert.

SENATOR HILGERT: Thank you, Mr. President, members. I have another question from, believe it or not, a different constituent regarding the same issue, and I just wanted to ask Senator Janssen if he'd yield to one more question.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Yep.

SENATOR HILGERT: Senator Janssen, can you have more than one permit and thereby carry multiple weapons?

SENATOR JANSSEN: If you want, if you go back...you have to go back and take the training and pay for the training again...

SENATOR HILGERT: Okay.

SENATOR JANSSEN: ...to get qualified in another weapon.

SENATOR HILGERT: Okay. And I have another question.

SENATOR JANSSEN: But you can only carry one. You'd only carry one at a time.
